How did we get here?



- Things have not gone well since the cancelled workshop in March 2020.
- Previous workshops identified some highly contested issues, which we (the steering group) felt could not be resolved by virtual meetings.
- Personal overload during pandemic, felt by many.
- \rightarrow Little progress, hardly any communication.
- Things will improve!

Status BMBF proposal (1)



- One thing we did manage to do: Write pre-proposal to BMBF/PT-DLR, to support the nucleus of a national ESM support team (submitted July 2020).
- Things are difficult at BMBF, too. But PT-DLR recently came back to us, inviting us to submit a formal proposal. Funding level about €1.8 million for nominally three years.
- Two elements:
 - Overall coordination of national ESM strategy (1 experienced scientist as coordinator, 1 team assistant).
 - Four software specialists, who through collaboration with model developers and users create/re-write code infrastructure elements to bring them to modern standards.
 - Focus areas: HPC, workflows, modularisation/scalable coupling of components, scalable diagnostics.
 - We envision that work will progress through "sprints" subprojects over six to nine months, bringing rapid visible progress; how subprojects are chosen: TBD.
- This approach requires serious intellectual and resource commitment from model developers. The bulk of the development work will still happen at the modelling centres.

Status BMBF proposal (2)



- Unanimous in steering committee: DKK should submit the proposal and should be the employer of the national ESM support team members.
 - Neutral; no co-funding required (unlike federally supported institutions).
- Open and pragmatic: Where would software specialists physically sit?
 - They may have to be close to the developers/users.
 - The type of person we seek is in short supply; not having to move may well be an advantage for us.
- Proposal submission by late April seems realistic.
- Coordinator ideally to start in September 2021; software specialists in early 2022.

From here to the 15/16 November workshop (1)

- Recap: We have 41 contributions of model components that should have been presented today.
- Suggest instead:
 - Contributors upload recorded presentations over the April/May timeframe, to a password-protected website (location TBD).
 - Where appropriate, presentations could identify HPC/workflow/modularisation/diagnostics contributions & requirements.
 - We hold an online discussion forum about these presentations around June/early July.
 - Clarification/analysis/discussion, no decisions.
- This should serve as an effective preparation for the November workshop.
 - Using online formats for preparation is something we have learned during the pandemic.
- Contributing to the analysis of presentations will be an important task of the infrastructure working group (WGII, Biercamp, Kollet)

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From here to the 15/16 November workshop (2)

- The governance working group (WG3, Potthast, Rapp) should be re-activated immediately.
- Two tasks:
 - Develop proposal for procedure for selecting sub-projects performed by ESM support team.
 - Re-open consideration of the governance of the entire ESM strategy.
- Possible goal for November workshop: Agree on procedure for selecting sub-projects for software sprints.
 - Premature trying to select the sub-projects themselves.
